S.E. Australia, **Australia**

A delicious Chardonnay blend with notes of melon and zesty freshness on the finish. (2) **13% vol**

The elegant biscuit and brioche aroma is fitting of its 'Premier Cru' status. There is fine fruit flavour with the merest hint of oak to round out the citrus notes and extend the finish. (2) **12.5% vol**
